The Role of the Holy Spirit and of the Charismatic Renewal

The Multiple Roles of the Holy Spirit

- 1. Enlightening and Revealing
- Reveals Jesus, his person and his mission: divine and human, crucified and risen, the Alpha and the Omega
- Reveals and expands the "hope of Israel" (Acts 28. 20)
- Opens up the Scriptures
- Shows unity of all divine revelation in Jesus

2. CREATOR & THE GIVER OF LIFE

The Holy Spirit is the Creator Spirit, the Lord and the Giver of Life (Creed)

- Forms hope within the believer and within the Church, personal and corporate
- Giver of gifts, of manifold charisms
- Builds up the body of Christ
- Shaper of the unity of the body

3. THE HOLY SPIRIT AWAKENS MEMORY

- The Church reminds God of His covenant promises
- The Church acting in the Holy Spirit invokes God's memory
- For when God remembers, then God acts

 "The Holy Spirit is the Church's living memory" (CCC, 1099) 4. As the Holy Spirit of God, the Holy Spirit convicts Christians of all that is unholy. Conviction is a grace, not a condemnation, the first step to life-changing repentance. The Holy Spirit recalls to covenant fidelity.

The Three Cries

- "Abba, Father" (Rom. 8: 15 16; Gal. 4: 6)
- "Jesus is Lord" (1 Cor. 12: 3)
- "Marana tha! Come, Lord Jesus!" (1 Cor. 16: 22; Rev. 22: 17, 20)

THE AGENT OF ALL AUTHENTIC RENEWAL

- Re-centres everything in Jesus
- Orients everything to the Father
- Purifies our hope ("everyone who thus hopes in him purifies himself as he is pure" 1 John 3: 3)
- Orders everything to its true goal
- To the Lord's coming in glory
